I am writing to express my support of the Springfield Water & Sewer Commission's Industry Park Waterline Improvements & Elevated Tank Project. This project is crucial for our community to stay resilient during peak water usage times and to provide growth opportunities in key residential and industrial areas. Many businesses are making significant investments in Washington County and are creating new jobs. Currently Springfield has multiple distilleries under construction and one additional distillery is planning to make an announcement very soon. Nearly \$150 million of investment has already been committed and that number will double when the other distillery makes their announcement. As far as jobs are concerned, the distilleries under construction will bring 70 high paying jobs to Washington County and again that number will double once the other announcement is made.

This project has two main components. First, a new 500,000-gallon tank will be constructed in the current Springfield city zone. The second component to the project is adding a booster pump station near an existing tank on the city zone and creating a new pressure zone around the industrial park to supply water at a higher pressure to the new distilleries and other industrial customers. Another additional benefit of the project is that Springfield Water and Sewer Commission is currently working with Lebanon Water Works and the City of Danville to provide a connection to their water system. The projects should be complete and in service by the summer of this year. The new tank and booster station will be able work with these regional partners to get their treated water into this new pressure plane for purposes of redundancy. These regional water initiatives allow communities to become more resilient by working together.

In summary, our community is growing, and jobs are being created. The State and Tribal Assistance Grant that the Springfield Water & Sewer Commission is applying for will help all of Washington County for a long time to come and will position our community for growth.

The purpose of this letter is to provide support and information that the Springfield Water and Sewer Commission needs regarding a request they will be submitting to you for FY25 Community Project Funding. The Springfield industrial park waterline improvements & elevated tank Project will support current needs and allow for continued economic growth and opportunity for this community, and will be essential to our future needs.

Kentucky Bourbon Distillers Ltd. dba. Willett Distillery is building an additional distillery, and five barrel warehouses in the Springfield, Washington County area. Already we have completed the first of five planned warehouses and we began rolling barrels of whiskey into our first Springfield warehouse in October. We anticipate creating 35 new jobs within the first 36 months of beginning our operation. Our private investment within the first 36 months is estimated to exceed \$75 million. Our average salary at the facility will be \$55,850 per year and all full-time employees will be eligible for a robust benefits package.

Established over 80 years ago, Willett Distillery is a family owned and truly family operated distillery that produces both bourbon and rye whiskey. At our Bardstown location all stages of whiskey production take place, from milling grains to bottling. In addition to making whiskey, we welcome over 80,000 guest annually to our Bardstown facility. Our hospitality program includes tours, an espresso bar, patio bar and full restaurant. These gas line upgrades are essential to our future plans and we are excited for the promise of future possibilities our new Springfield home provides. As a former state representative for the Commonwealth of Kentucky, like yourself, I understand the importance of hearing directly from your constituents. Therefore, I am writing in support of the Springfield Water and Sewer Commission's request for FY25 Community Project Funding. Not only will the Springfield industrial park waterline improvements & elevated tank Project support current needs and allow for continued economic growth and opportunity for this community, but this project will also greatly assist our current development that is under way in Washington County.

My family along with other investors are developing something unique to Kentucky – an actual resort – that will create more than 150 new jobs in Washington County over the next few years. The project encompasses two phases, a boutique hotel phase and a distillery phase. In the Two Chimneys Resort and Spa phase we will build 40 villas, 20 cabins, an equestrian center, numerous outdoor activities, a sporting club with sporting clays course and a full service spa.

The Thousand Acres Distilling phase, which breaks ground next month, includes a small distillery, rick house, blending room and members lounge. Our private investment within the first 24 months is estimated to be \$16 million. Long term from 3 years to 5 years we anticipate additional private investment of \$200 million.

The new water tank is crucial to the functioning of the Two Chimneys Resort and Spa and the related Thousand Acres Distilling Company. Without the assurance of the water supply, the resort project cannot provide the level of service and amenities that tourists traveling through the Commonwealth will expect. Similarly, as you can imagine, a distillery cannot operate without clean and consistent water.
