Our ambulance department covers a large area, including Land Between the Lakes, a large portion of Lake Barkley, the I-24 portion of Trigg County and serves for a large training area for Fort Campbell Military Training Exercises and serves as mutual aid to surrounding counites.

With all this being said, we are in need of a new Trigg County Medical/Ambulance Building. The current building is very old and we have outgrown it. We ask for your support to help us obtain a grant for a new Trigg County Medical/Ambulance Building. The architect plan for a new building consists of 6 bedrooms, men's and women's locker rooms, training room, kitchen/dining/lounge area, 3 offices and a 6 bay ambulance garage that totals 7,500 square feet.
