Dear Honorable Representative Comer:

I am writing to express my support of the Lebanon Water Works Company's 2020 Tank Project. This project is crucial for our community to stay resilient during peak water usage times and to provide growth opportunities in key residential and industrial areas. Many businesses are making significant investments in Marion County and are creating new jobs. In the past year, Diageo has started production of their carbon-neutral plant making Bulleit Bourbon and has invested over \$130M in our community.

This project has two main components. First, the new tank will replace two existing ground storage tanks. Even though they have a combined storage capacity of nearly 2 Million Gallons (MG), when they are half empty, they do not provide sufficient pressure to be useful throughout most of the distribution network. The new tank will be 2 MG. Every drop will be elevated and useful to all Lebanon Water Works and Marion County Water District customers in Marion County. The second component to the project will include a new 16" transmission line to the north side of Lebanon. This area is a growing area in our region and we are currently limited with adequate water storage in this area. Both components of the project will eliminate the northern water pressure zone putting all of Lebanon on one pressure zone. The project will allow our community much more flexibility in areas which we can grow and will provide additional water system resiliency by eliminating the need for an existing booster pump station. Another additional benefit of the project is that Lebanon Water Works is currently working with

Springfield Water and Sewer to provide a connection to their water system. These regional water initiatives allow communities to become more resilient by working together. Lebanon Water Works already has a similar arrangement with Campbellsville Water and Sewer.

In summary, our community is growing and jobs are being created. The State and Tribal Assistance Grant that the Lebanon Water Works is applying for will help all of Marion County for a long time to come and will position our community for growth.
