Dear Honorable Representative Comer:

I am writing to express my support of the Springfield Water & Sewer Commission's Industry Park Waterline Improvements & Elevated Tank Project. This project is crucial for our community to stay resilient during peak water usage times and to provide growth opportunities in key residential and industrial areas. Many businesses are making significant investments in Washington County and are creating new jobs. Currently Springfield has multiple distilleries under construction and one additional distillery is planning to make an announcement very soon. Nearly \$150 million of investment has already been committed and that number will double when the other distillery makes their announcement. As far as jobs are concerned, the distilleries under construction will bring 70 high paying jobs to Washington County and again that number will double once the other announcement is made.

This project has two main components. First, a booster pump station will be installed near an existing water storage tank to create a new pressure zone around the industrial park to supply water at a higher pressure to the new distilleries and other industrial customers. The second component to the project is adding disinfection changes - switching the disinfectant from gaseous chlorine to an onsite mixed oxidant generator, which is a safe, reliable, cost-effective disinfectant. These improvements are needed to continue to provide high-quality water for the entire system and allow us to easily share water with other utilities when needed. Another additional benefit of the project is that Springfield Water and Sewer Commission just completed working with Lebanon Water Works and the City of Danville to provide connections to their water system. The booster station will be able work with these regional partners to get their treated water into this new pressure plane for purposes of redundancy. These regional water initiatives allow communities to become more resilient by working together.



In summary, our community is growing, and jobs are being created. The Community Project Funding that the Springfield Water & Sewer Commission is applying for will help all of Washington County for a long time to come and will position our community for growth.

The Springfield industrial park waterline improvements will support current needs and allow for continued economic growth and opportunity for this community, and will be essential to our future needs.

Kentucky Bourbon Distillers Ltd. dba. Willett Distillery is building an additional distillery, and five barrel warehouses in the Springfield, Washington County area. Already we have completed the four planned warehouses. We anticipate creating 35 new jobs within the first 36 months of beginning our operation, which is nearing completion with planned distilling in late 2025 or early 2026. Our private investment at this stage in the project is set to exceed \$75 million. Our average salary at the facility will be \$55,850 per year and all full-time employees will be eligible for a robust benefits package.

Established over 80 years ago, Willett Distillery is a family owned and truly family operated distillery that produces both bourbon and rye whiskey. At our Bardstown location all stages of whiskey production take place, from milling grains to bottling. In addition to making whiskey, we welcome over 80,000 guest annually to our Bardstown facility. These gas line upgrades are essential to our future plans and we are excited for the promise of future possibilities our new Springfield home provides.
